## 2. Sarvoday Vidhyarthi Vikas Yojna :

Runanubandh was started project **Sarvoday** on 18/07/2021 . its projects main purpose is development of single parent children studying in PMC School & other pvt school . The students are given skill development training under Sarvoday Vidhyarthi Vikas Yojna. Also it provides scholarship to needy and talented student.

### **Project Background;**

India, one of the largest democracies in the World has a Population of over 1.3 billion as of today. Most of the people in India are living below the poverty line and are facing many problems, viz., lack of food, shelter, health care, education and unemployment and thus the people live in utter poverty. Poverty has always been recognized as the major cause of death and disability. Poverty brings on lack of safe Drinking Water, inadequate food, poor health care and poor education. All these will have an effect on health.

The poverty situation in the Indian context, reflects in the State of Maharashtra. The families in slums and rural areas are normally large and often face the problems and the earning members of the family unable to cope up with the situations. Sometimes they may not get work to earn. Eventually they migrate to other places in search of livelihood or starve to meet death or disease. The struggle of the poor starts in the womb. The child in the womb suffers from the consequences of malnutrition in the mother.

### **Project Need**

Poverty has always been recognized as the major cause of disease, death, and disability. Now the World Health Organization (WHO) came out with the statement the Poverty is the 'ruthless killer'. Large families in urban slum areas often face these problems and the earning members of the family are unable to cope-up with the situations and survival becomes difficult. The relief often comes in the form of death leaving the children as orphans and destitute. These children starve without shelter, food and clothing and roam along the streets.

### **Project Location and Duration**

Orphan children living in the urban slums of Pune district of Maharashtra. Duration of the project will be for 5 years i.e. 60 months. (its our running Project started from 18 July 2021)

### **Target group & Population:**

Poor and disadvantaged community in urban slum of Warje Malwadi village Pune district of Maharashtra

**Beneficiaries :** 100 Orphan , Semi orphans Children

- 1) who are with only single parents. (either mother or father is dead)
- 2) Also we have needy children whose family is suffering from financial condition.

To overall care, education and skill development of orphan children in urban slums of Pune district of Maharashtra.

**.Name of Activity: Daily extra Tuition Batch**

**Date:** 1.06.2022 To 15/4/2023

**Venue:** Runanubandh Office

**Participants:** 80

**Summary:** When we started this project in 2021, we only had classes and activities sessions for students for one day a week, then we realized that the students coming to us are very undeveloped in writing, reading, arithmetic. Hasn't happened. Lack of early understanding of what is being taught in school is causing a loss of self-confidence resulting in children avoiding going to school or looking for new activities to take vacations. Students being single parents or from very poor families cannot afford outside coaching classes. Many children don't have a father so mother goes out to work all day and no one is educated at home so children are neglected by their parents.

So we started daily tutoring classes for students from June 2022. In this, we have tried to increase children's reading, writing, arithmetic, English reading and writing ability by paying proper attention to the child. We tried to track the progress of each student by keeping records of the assessment of the children every month. Initially, the number of students coming to us was few. But seeing the progress of the students coming to us, other students started coming to us for tuition. We also conducted classes from class 5th to 10th by having paid teachers and running 3 batches in a day. And tried to make progress of the child.

**Summary:** We held a workshop for the students to make sugar jewelry (Halwyache Dagine) in honor of Makar Sankranti. This activity was designed to challenge gender stereotypes because boys who are in adolescence rarely enjoy doing tasks that are typically performed by girls. Through numerous sessions, we attempted to convey the "Gender" lesson, stressing that there should be no gender discrimination and that boys and girls should work together to complete any tasks. Boys should also respect their mothers, sisters, and aunts and assist them with household chores. After creating the jewelry, the students shared messages of respect and the need to refrain from passing judgment on others with one another before saying "Happy Makar Sankranti" to conclude the lesson.



**13.Name of Activity:** Exposure of Child Friendly Room and interaction to know the Police's work

**Venue:** Warje Police Station's Child Friendly Room, Pune

**Participants:** 15

**Summary:** In collaboration with Hope for the Children Foundation we took students to the Child Friendly room so they could talk to the Child Welfare Police Officer, visit the police station, and learn more about what precisely Child Friendly is. The students engaged with Mr. Tonde - Thane Amaldar, who also showed them the police station and the child-friendly room. Students frequently questioned how they could become police officers, what types of jobs were available in each police station, and how they could contact the police in an emergency. Mr. Tonde responded to their queries, urged them to concentrate on their studies, and provided information on the Pocso Act and the Juvenile Justice Act. The students were excited because they often attend the session in the child-friendly room.

**Summary:** The needy and bright kids who qualify for education support have received a school bag, shoe and



a uniform in an effort to motivate them to attend class regularly and reduce the dropout rate. All of the students belonged to a socioeconomically disadvantaged group, and when a family member stopped earning money, all of the members of the family began to experience financial strain and were unable to provide their children with the necessities. In order to relieve their parents' concern and enable them to concentrate more on their work/jobs, we have chosen to provide a school bag, shoe, and uniform. **The program was attended by chief guest Sh. **Participants:** 30

**Summary:** Students have a place to explore, create, interact, and develop their digital literacy in school computer labs. More students can be accommodated in these technologically advanced classrooms because of their increased processing power, online learning, and other features. Therefore, we built a computer lab in our center so that students might utilize it and become computer literate. In addition, a lab has been installed where children can experience playing scientific games to strengthen their memory and develop an interest in science. Students seem so excited and happy by using computers and games.



**19.Name of Activity:** Nutritional Food

**Date:** 15.06.2022 to 31.03.2023

**Venue:** Runanubandh Office

**Frequency :** Every Sunday

**Participants:** 80

**Summary:** Early-life poor diets can result in vitamin and nutritional deficiencies, such as vitamin A deficiency, which lowers children's resistance to infection, raises their chance of blindness, and makes them more susceptible to common childhood illnesses





like diarrhea. In order to encourage students to eat nutritious meals on a regular basis and prevent them from doing so, RSS decided to serve them. Seasonal fruits, fruit salads, and wholesome cooked meals have been offered. Students learn about living a healthy lifestyle and how to do so by eating fruits and other readily available foods at home through these kinds of activities.

**Date:** Jan .2023 to March 2023

**Frequency :** Every Sunday

**Venue:** Runanubandh Office

**Participants:** 40



**Summary :**The Team of of Runanubandh Samstha approached Baya Karve Women's Study Centre for a purpose. Runanubandh samstha conducts 'Sanskar Vargas' for the students since last few years regularly, so that they can help children in developing good habits. However, they observed that children from 8th and 9th Std not really like these activities and need different creative inputs from teachers. Therefore, Runanubandh staff wanted a program based on creative thinking, brain development activities for 8th and 9th Std students, which Dilasa agreed to develop.

Following Activities were conducted 1. Ice breaking games – the purpose was to establish rapport with the children, to draw their attention towards the objectives of the project and increase their readiness to carry out actual tasks. 2. Language development exercises – It has been observed that children are weak in articulation and vocabulary. So activities such as letter to self, making advertisement were conducted 3. Creative thinking – creativity games and exercises such as different uses of a very common object, innovative product development, complete the story, complete the picture 4. Logical thinking – few exercises based on entrance exam and coding were conducted 5. Affective development – Few games, prayers, storytelling activities were especially planned

Over all remarks form Karve Women's Study Centre – Children at Runanubandh are very genuine and studies. In first workshop only they built a good rapport with the trainers. They were all ready to learn new things. They were enthusiastic and taking initiatives to volunteer the work. However, it has been observed that these children are from lower economic strata of the society. There are not exposed to such creative activities in school or at home. Hence they were taking time to understand and grasp the methods and techniques of the tasks, but once they are through then they were brilliant in presenting their thoughts. Their general knowledge was also weak but they promised to read newspapers and to try to increase GK.

## **22 . Name of Activity: Marathi Bhasha Din**

**Date:** 27 Feb 2023

**Venue:** Runanubandh Office

**Participants:** 50

**Summary :** Children's competitions were organized on the occasion of Marathi Language Day. Children presented songs, dances, stories and speeches. The guests were invited and they gave prizes to the children.

**Summary :** When we started this project in 2021, we only had classes and activities sessions for students for one day a week, then we realized that the students coming to us are very undeveloped in writing, reading, arithmetic. Hasn't happened. Lack of early understanding of what is being taught in school is causing a loss of self-confidence resulting in children avoiding going to school or looking for new activities to take vacations. Students being single parents or from very poor families cannot afford outside coaching classes.

Many children don't have a father so mother goes out to work all day and no one is educated at home so children are neglected by their parents. So we started daily tutoring classes for students from June 2023.

In this, we have tried to increase children's reading, writing, arithmetic, English reading and writing ability by paying proper attention to the child. We tried to track the progress of each student by keeping records of the assessment of the children every month. Initially, the number of

students coming to us was few. But seeing the progress of the students coming to us, other students started coming to us for tuition. We also conducted classes from class 5<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> by having paid teachers and running 3 batch's in a day. In this year we extended one more batch of 10<sup>th</sup> class & arranged 7<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> Sepreated batch. we teaching them English, Mathematics ,Science. And trying to make progress of the child.

### **Success Story :**


